Travel advice during the works

Drivers

The bridge will be closed to all vehicles during the works. Signed diversion routes will be in place, as shown on the map opposite. Drivers following the signed diversion and in the direction of travel shown on roadside signs will not be liable for the Congestion Charge.

Alternative river crossings both within and outside the Congestion Charge zone will be available as normal during the works.

If using an alternative route within the Congestion Charge zone on Monday to Friday between 07:00-18:00, drivers will need to pay the Congestion Charge. Please visit **tfl.gov.uk/congestioncharge** to pay the charge or find out more.

Businesses

Bus passengers

Routes RV1 and 78 will be diverted during the closure, while route 42 will stop running when it reaches the south side of Tower Bridge – it will not serve stops further north of the river. Journeys on other services throughout the area may take longer than normal.

Pedestrians


Pedestrians will be able to cross the bridge throughout most of the works, however it may take you longer and be busier than usual.

Cyclists



These essential major maintenance works on Tower Bridge will ensure this 122 year old iconic landmark continues to serve as a vital London crossing.



The works will include:

- major maintenance to the bridge lifting mechanisms
- replacing the timber decking and resurfacing the road and walkways
- replacing expansion joints along the bridge to provide a smooth running surface
- waterproofing the brick arches that form the approach to the bridge

Tower Bridge Exhibition will remain open as normal during the works.
